

By way of introduction, my name is Andy Hunt, I've been a christian for 20 years and I've had a keen interest in eschatological issues for almost as long.

I've have read a lot of quality exegesis by true bible scholars, and also a lot of interpretations and predictions by people who mix up astrology, numerology, pyramids, catholicism, etc.

Now, I know that date setting is frowned upon in the church, and I don't want to be a heretic, or to teach false doctrine, or lead people up the garden path, so I thought it best to submit my thoughts to my church leadership first.

I've never attempted anything like this myself or even thought it the biblical thing to do, until two weeks ago when I literally stumbled upon the dates for the Rapture and the Second Coming. I wasn't trying to work them out or anything, the pieces of the puzzle just fell into place whilst I was musing. I then fasted and prayed for 3 days over what I'd discovered and God confirmed to me with a sign from the story of Abraham.

It's best I lay out my thoughts bit by bit... (and note bits of this are not my original work)

Starting with a Hot Potato then...

Can we know the time of the Second Coming??

I believe the Statements made by Jesus in Matthew 24, Mark 25 and Acts 1 are time related statements and meant for the people they were spoken to, not for all time,

Matthew 24:36, Mark 25:13
No one knows about that day or hour, not even the angels in heaven, nor the son, but only the Father

Acts 1:7 *It is not for you to know the times and dates that the Father has set by his own authority.*

Jesus says that he does not know the hour of his return in Matthew and Mark, I'm 100% certain that this is not still the case and Jesus does now know when he's returning, so this would point to the statement being time related.

a good example of a time related statement is Jesus also said "Don't tell anyone who I am" but we don't follow this as doctrine.

The Question Jesus answers in Acts 1:7 is "Are you at this time going to restore the kingdom of Israel?", Not "When are you coming back?"

In addition to this, Jesus' statements were made before he gave John the Book of Revelation in AD68(ish), at which point he quite clearly does know the full picture, and it's timing. To dispute this matter is to deny Jesus is God and One with the Father.

I believe there are as many scriptures that would point towards us knowing the time of the Second Coming

Daniel 12:9-10 *Go your way Daniel because the words are closed up and sealed until the*

time of the end... .. None of the wicked will understand, but those who are wise will understand.

Luke 8:17 *For there is nothing hidden that will not be disclosed and nothing concealed that will not be known or brought out into the open*

Amos 3:7 *Surely the Sovereign Lord does nothing without revealing his plan to his servants the prophets*

1 Thessalonians 5:4 *But you brothers are not in darkness so that this day should surprise you like a thief.*

We are the bride of Christ, and would it not seem reasonable for the Groom to reveal the date of the wedding, so that the Bride may make herself ready?

I'd like to hear peoples thoughts and responses to this one, because if i'm wrong at this point, then the rest of what I believe God has given me counts for nowt.....

Daniels 70 7's (Daniel 9:20-27)

Many will be familiar with the work of Sir Robert Anderson, adding together the 7 sevens and the 62 sevens and coming up with 69 Weeks, a 483 year period between the Nehemiah's call to build Jerusalem's Walls in 445BC until Jesus's entry into Jerusalem in 32AD. I believe his work is flawed.

If God had meant 69 sevens I believe he would have put 69 sevens, not 7 sevens and 62 sevens.

In Daniel 9, Daniel is prophesying two separate comings of Jesus, it says that Jerusalem will be built in "times" of trouble, not "a time" of trouble, and then you have a pretty bad translation in the NIV of Jerusalem being built with "streets" and a "ditch". The translated word "streets" means "plaza" or "square", and the Plaza was an important part of the original Jerusalem, where as, modern Jerusalem is surrounded by irrigation ditches.

Daniel 9:25 From the issuing of a decree to rebuild Jerusalem until the Anointed One, the ruler, comes, there will be 7 sevens and there will be 62 sevens.

Daniels 62 Sevens...

Nehemiah is released by King Ataxerxes to return to Jerusalem in 445BC (Neh2:1) and Returns to King Ataxerxe 12 Years later in 433BC (Neh13:6)

Although Nehemiah rebuilds the walls of Jerusalem almost immediately in 52 days (Neh 6:15), he does not in fact start rebuilding Jerusalem until Ch11 of Nehemiah which isn't actually dated. A natural read would make this date appear to be near the end of his stay, if this date (24 Tishri) was 436BC or 435BC then exactly 434 (62 Sevens) later on 24 Trishi 2BC or 24 Trishi 1BC Jesus was born (The coming of the Anointed one)

The birth of Christ is now believed to be 2BC (Not 4BC as was thought for many years due to Christ being born whilst Cyrenius was Govenor of Syria) Archeology has now revealed that Cyrenius, govenor of Syria, was elected twice so he was govenor from 7BC to 1BC.

Dan 9:26 reads, after the Sixty two sevens, the Anointed one will be cut off and will have nothing. I believe this was fulfilled in Jesus' birth as a baby and coming to earth, coming from the right hand of the Father he's been cut off and has nothing.

Daniels 7 Sevens...

The next time in history where there is a call to rebuild the streets and restore the holy places is on 6th July 1967 on the 2nd day of The Six Day War.

Check out Rabbi Shlomo Goren's prayers during the live broadcast to the nation during the Storming of the Temple Mount.

So it follows that there will be Seven 7's until the coming of the anointed one, which would make the Rapture September 23rd 2015.

September 23rd 2015 is Yom Kippur and also Rosh Hashana.

Daniels 1 Seven...

Followed by 1 seven which will be the tribulation followed by the Second coming in 2022.

That was my Revelation, I was shocked at it's simplicity, so I then fasted and prayed for 3 days whilst seeking confirmation from God that this was from him. God gave me two signs confirming that what is here is correct.

Confirmation I believe given by God that these dates are correct

On the third day of my fast I was reminded that there was 1948/9 years between the birth of Adam and the birth of Abraham, and that there was 1948/9 years between the birth of Jesus and the birth of Israel, Jesus is also referred to as the last Adam in scripture.

Modern day Israel is a parallel for Abrahams life, and was reborn in 1948, and Jesus is coming again in 2022, this gives us a 75 years (360 day year) time period, then what happens in Abrahams 75th Year?

Genesis 12:4-5 He is called by God and travels to the land of Canaan, he goes to the promised land.

A week later, whilst reading something else I read the word, *times-of-the-gentiles*, and knew immediately that I had to look at this time frame again.

Working backwards from 2015, if the T-O-T-G is 2 days (1971 360 day prophetics years), this would bring us to the date AD44 as being the beginning of the T-O-T-G.

During AD44 Peter has his vision of the Sheet being let down and the first Gentiles respond to the gospel.

And this is where I submit my findings to you in chart form as it's easier to see than it is to explain.
